



Working towards a **SUSTAINABLE CAMPUS**

The University's Campus 2010 Building for the Future Program is underway with the completion of the new School of Information Technologies on Darlington Campus in June 2006. The new Law School building will be constructed on this site between Fisher and Eastern Avenue Lecture Theatre for completion in 2009. A central student administration building and library will be built next to Wentworth building and will be completed in 2008.

The Edgeworth David building and the Stephen Roberts Theatre were demolished from this site in early 2006 and the School of Geosciences temporarily re-located. Up to 90 per cent of the demolished concrete, bricks and rubble were successfully recycled. This material would have previously been sent to landfill but the efforts of the University and the demolition company have made these cost savings and environmental savings possible.

Separating aluminium for recycling

The following materials were able to be separated and recycled during demolition:

Demolished material	Quantity recycled
Bitumen	130m ³
Garden Organics	60m ³
Bricks	21000m ³
Concrete	2000m ³
Timber	60%
Scrap metal	35 tonne
Copper	3.5 tonne
Rock (shale and clay)	2000m ³ black shale
